The Nova campus houses two high achieving elementary schools. Our continuous attention to research-based teaching strategies helps to meet the individual needs of all students.

Once your child is accepted into the Nova schools, he/she is entitled to remain at Nova through the twelfth grade. The articulation process is a major strength of the Nova schools.

School hours are 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Broward County school buses provide transportation to Nova students as long as they live outside the walking boundaries of the schools. Before and After Care are available from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and from 3:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.



At both schools, classrooms are equipped with state-of-the-art computers and have Internet access. Teachers incorporate technology into their instructional activities and classroom centers. Computers are available in the classrooms, computer lab, and media center. Mobile laptop computer labs are readily available for classroom use. Many classrooms also have document cameras, projectors and even i-Pods.

Students in Kindergarten through fifth grade attend a thirty minute special each day. The specials might include: Music, Media, Physical Education, Art, and Spanish.



We know that every child is unique and we provide special programs to help meet the needs of our students: Varying Exceptionalities, Speech and Language, Gifted, and English Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) Classes.

A variety of activities are offered for the students: Art Club, Chess Club, Chorus, Peer Mediation, Safety Patrol, Student Council, and Morning Announcement Crew.

Nova welcomes parent involvement in our school SAF (School Advisory Forum), PTA (Parent Teacher Association), and SAC (School Advisory Council). Many parents volunteer in the classroom, chaperone field trips, and serve as room parents. Parents and community members mentor students throughout the school year on an individual basis.
